ROSE GARDEN BRICK PROGRAM

IN 2003, the Southampton Rose Society designed, built and dedicated the magnificent SRS Rose Garden at the Rogers Memorial Library to the Village and people of Southampton. Each year, people from all over the world visit the garden to enjoy its beauty. Many of the bricks in the paths around the garden are inscribed with tributes. The cost of an inscription is \$250.



PRUNING & PLANTING WORKSHOP

KNOWLEDGABLE, TALENTED rose expert Peter Bertrand will present his annual Pruning and Planting session to take place in the SRS Garden at Rogers Memorial Library on Saturday, April 20, from 10:00 am–12:00pm.

Peter will demonstrate a simple hands-on way to plant a bare root rose. His clear and easy steps will turn guesswork into the right work to do for a young rose. Peter shares tried and true methods he's acquired by rose gardening on the East End for many years. Questions are always welcome at this lively event. Peter often reveals his secrets too!

David Dawn, for whom the rose garden is named, was Peter's mentor.



ON FRIDAY May 3 from 4-6 pm, Peter Bertrand will lead the ever-popular Children's Mini Rose & Art Workshop at the Rogers Memorial Library.

Peter will demonstrate how to plant a miniature rose in a pot and how to care for it as it grows. Participants will pot their own plant, with assistance from parents and Peter, to take home with them. Children will also color in garden line drawings by longtime SRS member Nancy Rollins. They may create Mother's Day cards with their finished art by using supplies from the Art Nanny of Southampton.

An Interview With Peter Marino

N 2023, Peter Marino's sizable list of architectural honors lengthened when he garnered the prestigious Andrew Markopoulous Award. Then, he amassed a considerable number of ribbons and trophies at the Southampton Rose Society Show, also in 2023!

In fact, Peter says the antidote to his high-powered, globetrotting job is to find gardening bliss at his home in Southampton, New York.

SRS President Jim Berkrot spoke with Peter about his love of gardening, growing roses, his art foundation and more.

Peter grew up in New York City, came to eastern Long Island each summer with his family as a child and has been enchanted with Southampton ever since. Ultimately, he and his wife Jane made the Village their home. In 1993, they purchased a beautiful property in Southampton Village and continually work to beautify its grounds. Integral to its present design, the garden has many specimen roses, all dearly loved, tended and appreciated by the Marinos.

Peter visited the Parrish Art Museum on Jobs Lane during his childhood trips. Its departure from the Village, later in his life, sparked a drive to revitalize the cultural environment he had grown up with. Peter aimed his sights on acquiring the old Rogers Memorial Library building for that purpose. "Southampton has an insatiable appetite for culture," Peter mused, "in addition to the Southampton Arts Center and the Historical Society, there is always room for more."

With extensive and painstaking renovation, the historic library building provides a perfect space for his enormous, world class art collection. Also, it provides a venue for more cultural events downtown. The old library is now completely transformed and today it is the Peter Marino Art Foundation where art exhibitions and cultural events take place May through October. The rose garden in front of the PMAF on Jobs Lane is in honor of Peter's mother who had a passion for roses. This adds a sixth downtown garden specifically devoted to Southampton's official flower, the rose. For the PMAF garden, Peter chose red roses "precisely to blend into the wonderful color of the building's columns and red brick exterior."

At the very front of the garden is low-growing holly that borders groundcover Rosas Fire Meidiland and Red Meidiland. These varieties are full of flowers from early summer into late fall. Fire Meidiland bears large clusters of fully double blooms in deep red with bright gold eyes. Red Meidiland has clusters of daintier single red flowers with yellow and white centers. There are six other red hybrid varieties in the middle ground of the garden too: Abbaye de Cluny, Black Cherry, Drop Dead Red, Red Drift, Sweet Mademoiselle, and Yves Piaget.

Peter is intrigued with roses, both growing in the wild or in manicured gardens.

"For me, the SRS is a 100% feel-good mechanism which is what we need more of. I find the members knowledgeable and enthusiastic, and that is because they are involved in creating and admiring beauty."

In 2023, Peter generously donated two beautiful sterling silver trophies for the Southampton Rose Society's Annual Rose Show. The trophies are awarded yearly at the competition. Peter has
